Removal goods	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Registration of shipper at his new residence in Germany (ANMELDEBESTAETIGUNG).</b></li> <li>• <b>Copy of shipper's passport.</b></li> <li>• Inventory.</li> <li>• <b>A letter of third party (employer, German Embassy) confirming that shipper has lived and worked for more than 12 months in foreign country.</b></li> <li>• Renting contract of a domicile (if possible).</li> <li>• Contract of employment.</li> <li>• Customs registration form 0350.</li> <li>• <b>A letter signed by shipper that following goods are not inside his shipment: firearms – alcohol – tobacco – cigarettes – tea – coffee.</b></li> </ul>	Duty free entry if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>The customer has lived in foreign country for more than 12 months or if he is a citizen of a foreign country.</b></li> <li>• <b>The household goods and/or vehicles have been owned and used for a minimum of 6 months before their shipping date (vessel departure) to Germany.</b></li> <li>• <b>The goods must stay in possession of the importers for 12 months after importation.</b></li> </ul>	Removal goods are only granted duty free entry if they are imported within one year of the owner establishing his residence or secondary residence in Germany.  Removal goods are the objects that the immigrant already used at his previous domicile either for his personal use or for vocational or industrial purpose and which are capable of being re-used in Germany for the identical purpose corresponding to his economic situation.  The exemption of duties is granted provided there are no unsuitable advantages of Customs.
Diplomatic removals	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Certificate from the Embassy or the Consulate.</li> <li>• Form 0349.</li> </ul>	Duty free entry for foreign diplomats if bilateral agreement with origin country.	The customs authorities are authorised to make an inspection at the domicile. Even if all documents are provided, the carrier cannot guarantee the clearance at the Border.
Wedding trousseaux	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Marriage certificate.</li> <li>• Certificate of registration with the German Police authorities.</li> <li>• Renting contract (proof of a domicile).</li> <li>• Inventory.</li> </ul>	Duty free entry for: Wedding trousseaux and gifts (not exceeding Euro 1000 in value per gift) belonging to persons coming from a non-EEC country where they have resided for at least the previous 12 consecutive months. The goods must be imported between 2 months before the wedding and up to 4 months after it. The goods must stay in possession of the importers for 12 months after importation. Tobacco and alcohol are excluded from these provisions.	By wedding trousseaux, it is meant: The objects acquired or received from other persons on the occasion of the marriage and intended to equip the house for personal use and for use of the husband and wife of property.  No motorised vehicles.  If the household goods are imported before the marriage, proof must be furnished that the marriage will take place within 2 months (the time-limit can be extended if requested).

Excluded from duty free entry are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tobacco and Alcohol.</li> <li>• Commercial vehicles.</li> <li>• Objects that were used by the dead person for his profession (except portable tools and instruments).</li> <li>• Stocks of raw materials, or finished or half-finished products.</li> </ul>	By inherited property it is meant: Used objects for which legatee can furnish proof that he received the goods from the testator (only in case of death) and that these goods constitute his share of the inheritance or legacy.
Motor cars	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Copy of title showing ownership.</b></li> <li>• <b>Copy of the last registration in foreign country for a minimum of 6 months before the vehicle has been shipped to Germany.</b></li> </ul>	Duty free entry provided the shipper has used the car for at least 6 months before importation.	After the Customs clearance, a technical inspection performed by the vehicle registration office is required. A title will then be issued.

This certificate must be in German or accompanied by a certified true translation</li> <li>• Form 38 (SV 0802).</li> </ul>	Importation admitted provided: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is no report or suspicion of infectious illness.</li> <li>• No case of rabies has been notified within a radius of 20km from the place of origin of the animal during 3 months prior to the date the health certificate was issued.</li> </ul>	The health certificate must be valid 10 days (20 days for animals coming from non-European countries) from the date it has been made out.  Importation is subject to rabies vaccination: refer to animal protection - epidemic – decree.

Generalities			<p>Due to the great number of importation restrictions and prohibitions, it is advisable before each intended importation to ask the nearest German Customs office or German representation in a foreign country, for the concerned conditions.</p> <p><b>Customs inspection is made concerning items which are included in the Washington Agreement on endangered species, such as tropical wood, trophies, stuffed animals, corals, shells, etc. These items will automatically be confiscated and legal proceedings against the customer may be initiated.</b></p>
